<p>MOCA simulation course at an <b>ASA-endorsed simulation center</b> and course follow-up materials.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The follow-up materials must be completed to receive 25 points.</li> <li>At least one instructor must be an ABA diplomate participating in MOCA.</li> </ul>	3	25
<p><b>Other on-site simulation course</b> – Realistically replicates clinical scenarios that participants can work through in a manner like what they may experience in clinical practice.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>At least one instructor must be an ABA diplomate participating in MOCA.</li> </ul>	1	15
<p><b>Online simulation</b> – Realistically replicates clinical scenarios online.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>ASA Anesthesia SimSTAT</b> (up to 5 points per module; you only get credit for the same SimSTAT course once in a three-year period).</li> </ul>	1	25
<p><b>Other ABMS Member Board QI activities</b> – Report credit you received from another ABMS Board by which you are certified.</p>	1	25

<p><b>Institutional/departmental quality improvement project leader</b> – Initiate and/or guide the work of a team and serve as the key contact responsible for communicating with team members, stakeholders, and the ABA.</p>	1	25
<p><b>Quality improvement plan to improve patient outcomes based on feedback</b> from one of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Quality data registries</li> <li>• Joint Commission’s Focused Professional Practice Evaluation (FPPE) process</li> <li>• Joint Commission’s Ongoing Professional Practice Evaluation (OPPE) process</li> <li>• 360 professional reviews</li> <li>• Patient experience of care surveys</li> <li>• ASA courses available on the <a href="#">ASA website</a> (search for Quality Improvement)</li> <li>• <b>ACGME Program Evaluation and Improvement</b></li> </ul>	1	25

<p><b>Clinical pathway development participant</b> – Contribute to the development of structured multidisciplinary care plans to inform clinical practice based upon evidence-based guidelines while optimizing efficiency.</p>	1	15
<p><b>ABMS Multi-Specialty Portfolio Program leader</b> – Individual healthcare organizations can apply and gain approval for administering group quality improvement activities.</p>	1	25

<p><b>Multicenter Perioperative Outcomes Group (MPOG): ASPIRE</b> provider feedback emails – Practitioners at an active MPOG site can receive a monthly performance feedback email from ASPIRE to review their personal performance on quality measures to direct practice improvements.</p> <p><a href="#">Become an MPOG member &gt;</a></p>	1	25
<p><b>Case evaluation, M&amp;M, case discussion or practice improvement CME</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Case evaluation – assess your practice and implement changes designed to improve patient outcomes</li> <li>• Morbidity &amp; Mortality (M&amp;M) – peer review of adverse (or potentially adverse) patient outcomes to learn and prevent the incidence of future errors or complications</li> <li>• Case discussion – peer review discussion of a unique case or issue</li> <li>• Practice improvement CME – evidence-based performance measures and QI interventions are used to identify areas of improvement in patient care</li> </ul>	1	15
<p><b>Point-of-care learning</b> – Self-directed knowledge acquired during patient care (i.e., researching cases and outcomes)</p>	1	15
<p><b><a href="#">Point-of-Care Ultrasound Certificate Program</a></b> (1 point per hour up to 10 points)</p>	1	10
<p><b>AQI NACOR: Measure Review and Quality Improvement Action Plan</b> – Submit data to the Anesthesia Quality Institute’s National Anesthesia Clinical Outcomes Registry (AQI NACOR) to review data, track benchmarks and create and implement improvement plans based on NACOR feedback.</p> <p><a href="#">How to Submit Data &gt;</a></p>	1	25
