Here are our top five FAQs as we approach the end of the year.

How can I attest to my Quality Improvement (QI) activities?

Log in to [ABA GO](#), click on the QI tab of your dashboard and click the blue "Attest" button. Click the box beside "I attest that I have completed 25 points of ABA-approved QI activities" and click the "Submit" button. QI activities are subject to audit, so keep documentation of your completed activities.

How do I submit my CMEs?

You can self-report your CME activities, including activities you completed in previous years, in [ABA GO](#). Log in, click on the CME tab and click "Report New CME." If you are participating in CME for MOCA Minute, your credits earned from the ASA will be reported to us in late January 2024. Need additional assistance? My certification expires this year, and I've completed my MOCA components. What happens next?

The top portion of your progress report in [ABA GO](#) will show "Approved for Certification" in green when you complete all your requirements. In late December, we will post a congratulatory letter in your portal and our [directory](#) will show your new certificate issue date.

I've answered all my MOCA Minute questions, but my performance is below the $\geq .10$ standard and my certification expires this year. What can I do?

In January, we'll move your 10-year MOCA cycle forward one year, so you'll have until Dec. 31, 2024, to complete all components. Any CME credits you completed in the first year of your original cycle will be removed. Once you complete all components and pay the registration fee, we'll send you a new certificate.

In 2024, you'll have two options for completing the assessment component:

- **OPTION 1: Continue participating in MOCA Minute** to increase your performance standard by the end of 2024. Use your Knowledge Assessment Report and question history in your ABA GO portal to identify areas of focus.
- **OPTION 2: Take and pass the Anesthesiology Special Purpose Exam** in lieu of participating in MOCA Minute, assuming you have completed all other MOCA requirements. You can take it once for free if you register by June 30.

What happens if I don't answer all my MOCA Minute questions by 11:59 p.m. ET Dec. 31?

You can answer as many as 30 questions per day. Any unanswered questions will be counted as incorrect, which will lower your MOCA Minute performance value. If your value is $\geq .10$, you are meeting the performance standard. Review your MOCA Minute progress in your [ABA GO](#) portal.
